"Armenian Constitutional Right-Protective Centre" (ACRPC) NGO is kindly presenting the Annual Report 2004 for your consideration. It is my pleasure to mention that *ACRPC Strategic Plan for Developing Legal Culture in Armenia in 2003-2006* has been implemented (though not in their full volumes) in all its four directions:

1. The Human Rights School organized the Tenth Annual Advanced Course, which was held through collaborative teaching methodology facilitated by experts of the National Institute of Education (NIE) of the Ministry of Education and Science of Armenia.
(Funded by - *ICCO of the Netherlands*)
2. The Human Rights Library Network has been developed on the basis of regional Human Rights libraries in Vanadzor, Hrazdan, Gavar, Artashat, Dilijan and Sevan towns.
(Funded by - *US Embassy in Armenia's Department of State Public Affairs*)
3. Publications:
 - Publication of the scientific - methodological review *For the Sake of Justice* was continued.
(Funded by - *community members and ACRPC beneficiaries*)
 - In October 2004 a Memorandum of Agreement was signed with the Council of Europe's Directorate of Youth and Sport on the copyright of English-Armenian translation/publication of COMPASS - Human Rights Education Manual for Young People. The project is in its preparatory stage.
(Funded by - *Council of Europe Budapest and British Embassy in Armenia*)
4. The preparatory activities of the Community Leaders' Awareness Raising Program were held.
(Funded by - *ICCO of the Netherlands*)

ACRPC passed annual external audit of 2004 financial statements, held by "SOS Audit" LLC, Armenia. The audit concluded that the statements had reflected the true picture of the organization's financial situation.

ACRPC developed its activity also in internal human resources and financial management, public relations and fundraising.

The organization has received small contribution from the community for the first time, which we acknowledge as greatly binding "Mandate of Confidence" for us.

I would like to assure all our partners, beneficiaries, community members, international, state and self-governing bodies that ACRPC will firmly go on with implementing its Strategic Plan for the sake of reaching its mission:

Armenian Constitutional Right-Protective Centre is a leading Human Right education NGO in Armenia. Its activities are directed by its sincere wish to cater to the legitimate needs of its beneficiaries.

Having started as a small organization operating mainly on the basis of the zeal, energy and commitment of a few volunteers, the organization has now made considerable progress in the areas of development of goals and strategies, institutional development, the human rights expertise, budgeting and accounting. It operates under a strategic plan geared to ensure the effectiveness and favourable impact of its activities on its beneficiary groups. In the areas of leadership, management of human and financial resources as well as establishing the satisfaction of beneficiaries, staff and society, steps have been taken and systems and instruments have been developed.

ACRPC has procedures to monitor and evaluate the performance of its Human Rights Annual Advanced Course learners: it conducts exams of the learning. It has started to introduce in the strategic plan procedures and practices to monitor and evaluate the performance of the organisation itself or of parts of its programme. The criteria used for evaluating the performance of learners are standardised as to what extent the evaluation of the work of learners is subjective and how ACRPC can develop and more or less standard set of criteria to evaluate the performance of learners. The evaluation of the effectiveness of the work is also carried out: how does the organisation evaluate/assess the relevance, usefulness and impact of its course, its legal publications and other education and information activities.

ACRPC is socially organized. In general, the organization is open and transparent, both internally and externally, for its beneficiaries and the whole community. The employees (called staff members) are more cooperative and progressive and goal-oriented, which is expressed in the vision and mission of the organization defined with joint efforts. Thus, the organization's culture is very instrumental in determining the type of people employed, their career aspirations, their educational backgrounds, and the like, which in turn promotes the cultural values of the organization.

“Pedagogical Initiatives” Armenian Association and “Armenian Constitutional Right-Protective Centre” non-governmental organization since 2001 have been implementing retraining academic courses for teachers interested in teaching Legal Subjects in secondary schools. The bases of the work are the teaching collaborative modes, which ensure each group member's active involvement in the process of learning, teaching and work management and control.

In fact, the main principle of training and retraining of the human resources of the field has been advancing successfully: the modes and technology of teaching process are also the main components of teaching content and the most important means for professional development as well.

The achievements of the past years give every reason to believe that in the subsystem of teachers' retraining ACRPC has become the leading bearer and implementer of pedagogical concept. The work of ACRPC may serve as a basis and a model in schools and higher educational institutions of the Republic in organizing the work of retraining the specialists.

4. Organizational Background

“Armenian Constitutional Right-Protective Centre” (ACRPC) NGO was established in 1988. The organization was registered in 1995, re-registered in 1999 and 2004 in the Ministry of Justice of Armenia. ACRPC has been carrying out the activity of disseminating *Human Rights* and *Democracy* ideas in the society through its beneficiaries and partner organizations within the frameworks of its SP:

- Since 1996 the HR School has released 310 LS¹ specialists, most of which are secondary school teachers and professors of educational establishments who educate about 40.000 pupils and students.
- In 1996 the Human Rights Library was established in Vanadzor and through development projects the HRL Network has been created that includes Lori, Tavoush, Kotayk, Gegharkounik and Ararat regions of Armenia, which serves the community with its more than 13000 pieces of literature.
- Since 1989 the legal scientific-methodological review “For the Sake of Justice” has being published. Up to December 2004, fifty issues have been published. The review is delivered to secondary schools and public libraries as a supplementary information aid to teachers and lecturers.

The organization carries out also informative and analytical scientific and methodological publications and translations. ACRPC has a sustainable management system, passes external annual audit and expertise evaluation.

ACRPC is associated with the UN Department of Public Information and is a member of international networks, such as:

- CRINGO- Caucasian Refugee and IDP NGO Network, which unites over 60 voluntary, independent, non-commercial, non-political organizations, working in Caucasus.
- Legal Aid is a coalition of the organizations providing free legal services and information dissemination.
- National Coalition of Organizations involved in the Campaign for Global Call to Action Against Poverty.

Since the year of its foundation ACRPC has developed its own organizational culture comprising the assumptions, presuppositions, values and norms of the organization's staff members and their beneficiaries. The organization is socially organized. The internal affairs are regulated due to the ACRPC Staff Regulations Manual.

The staff members' close team involving 16 people together with ten volunteers works to reach the mission and vision formulated due to unanimous endeavours.


We believe that eventually the Rule of Law based on the requirements of justice and tolerance will be established in Armenia and in the entire world!



Within the frameworks the following activities were carried out:*

9.1. Human Rights School

During 2004 the distance learning stage of the HRS Ninth Annual Advanced Course, started in 2003, went on, during which the School learners carried out their individual assignments. January 11-16, 2004, in "Lusakert" rest-home and August 26-31, 2004, in "Tsitsernak" camp the second and third sessions of the course and the final examination were held. During the sessions the learners assimilated the themes and methods required by the School academic program. From 75 learners the 47 have successfully passed their final exams and have been awarded with *Certificates of Completion of Qualification of LS Specialists*¹.

The School carried on preparatory measurements for the Tenth Annual Advanced Course, which included dissemination of the announcement, after which the applications for participation were received and the selection of potential learners was held.

The information on the activity was spread through the letters sent to all secondary schools of the Republic, ACRPC web-site and HRLN. From 102 applicants 77 passed the first stage of the selection, and they were invited to the interview; in the result 43 LS teachers from all the regions of the Republic signed contracts of participation².

- On October 12, 2004, the Educational Department organized a meeting with participants in the *World's Biggest Ever Lesson* in Vanadzor HR Library. The aim of the meeting was to award the participants in the April 2004 GCE Global Action Week with Certificates of Participation, as well as to plan for the next - 2005 Global Action Week.

LS school teachers from various regions of Armenia, representatives from state and local self-governing bodies, as well as from UNICEF Armenia and the EU TACIS-VET Armenia were invited to attend the meeting. The participants watched the video-film on activities implemented during April 19-25, 2004 Action Week. At the end of the meeting a committee for the April 25-29, 2005 program of "Educate to End Poverty" was formed and a national plan of actions was formulated.

¹ The rest of the learners have been going on with assimilating the HRS academic program and after full completion of the process they will be invited for their final exams.

HRLN continued provision of services to its beneficiaries.

- Cooperation was established with 60 local and international NGOs based in Armenia, which were engaged in the publication activity. In the result the HRLN book fund was enriched with more than 600 pieces of new books.
- The literature income and outcome operation system was clarified; the stock-taking and information entry of the literature into Winisis software program in Vanadzor HR Library went on and the 80% of the book fund was recorded.

Today the number of donators of literature makes about 80 people and organizations (see p. 18).

Within the frames of the ACRPC SP for 2003-2006 the project *Developing Human Rights Library Network in Armenia* has been implemented and on December 8 and 9, 2004, Artashat and Gavar HR libraries have been opened. To the events representatives of state governing, local self-governing bodies, as well as international and local organizations and the Mass Media participated.

The Network acting in five towns of the country - Vanadzor, Dilijan, Gavar, Hrazdan and Artashat was reequipped and developed the provision of services to the readers.

In 2004 the ACRPC Editorial Department published issues 49 and 50 of the legal scientific-methodological review *For the Sake of Justice*, supported by the community members and ACRPC beneficiaries.

It was distributed to its co-authors, LS teachers, collaborating organizations, the member-libraries of the HRLN, to every interested reader.

In December 2004 articles for the next 51-52 joint issue were received, and the publication fund contained the expenses needed for the publication of the next joint issue.

9.4. Public Relations

ACRPC gives much importance to collaboration, both with national and international organizations acting in HR and HRE fields and the state structures as well. Within the frameworks a series of joint activities were organized and/or initiated by ACRPC, among which were the following:

- On December 10, 2004, jointly with UNDP and UNDPI Armenian offices and in initiation with ACRPC the *Human Rights Day's* events were organized in Hrazdan HR Library.

Within the framework the following activities were organized:

- Human Rights Day Forum
- Released films on UN activity
- Visit to Hrazdan HR Library.

To the events representatives of religious, state and local self-governing powers, international and non-governmental organizations participated.

- On November 30, 2004, for the aim of elucidation of ACRPC activity to the wide public and also the presentation of ACRPC project of 2004-2007 *Developing Legal Culture in Armenia, 0410-0709*, a meeting with the representatives of the Mass Media was organized in the NGOs Room of Vanadzor Social Services Integrated Center. Representatives of Lori regional and republican leading information agencies participated in the meeting. The participants were introduced with the organization's SP for 2003-2006 and then the steps taken towards the implementation of the SP were presented. Also, the current projects implemented within the frameworks of the SP and the results anticipated to reach for the benefit of the community were presented to the participants.

- On November 15, 2004, UNDP Armenia Office and ACRPC jointly organized a seminar on *The Role and Functions of Human Rights Institutions and Ombudsman*, in Vanadzor Municipality.

Mr. Dean M. Gottehrer, International Ombudsman Expert, held the activity.

UNDP representatives, state and local self-governing bodies, NGOs, the Mass Media and ACRPC HR School graduate LS teachers, participated in the seminar.

June 3-7, 2004, the exhibition of the works presented within the framework of the *HR School Building Architectural Designs Tender* was organized in the National Museum-Institute of Architecture of Armenia¹. Representatives of state and self-governing bodies, local and international organizations, architects, representatives of constructional organizations and NGOs were invited to the event. Famous architect of Armenia Mr. Hrachik Poghosyan Academic, Chairman of the Selection Commission, presented the members of the Committee, announced the tender results and awarded the prizes.

9.4. Public Relations

- On 20 June 2004, in the town of Vanadzor, in initiation with the UNHCR Armenia Office and CRINGO Network, With financial support of UNHCR, CRINGO and Vanadzor Municipality the common yard of multi-flatted buildings N 11, 12 and 13 in District Taron-3 of Vanadzor town inhabited with refugees were reconstructed within a month: a shelter, benches and sports equipment for kids and adults were set up there. There were sports events, the kids of the refugee families were presented with gifts. The guests and refugees decorated the yard with nominal saplings.
- On May 26, 2004, within the frameworks of ACRPC initiation, Ms. Larisa Alaverdyan, Ombudsman of Armenia, visited Vanadzor. She had meetings with Lori Regional Governor and Deputy Mayor of Vanadzor City. She also visited ACRPC Office and the Human Rights Library and got acquainted with ACRPC activity, and also met with representatives of NGOs of Vanadzor. The Ombudsman and her office lawyers accepted more than 40 citizens for consulting and advice. At the end of the visit Ms. Alaverdyan was invited to Lori TV Station for live program.
- On March 31, 2004, the opening ceremony of the Anti-Corruption Information Center was held in Vanadzor. A memorandum on the implementation of Anti-Corruption Information Center's activities in Lori Region was signed with ACRPC. ACRPC has disposed space and an employee for the purpose of presenting the Center in the region. Every interested individual and organization can make use of the Center's literature fund representing publications on the best models of local and international anti-corruption actions in various fields. The activity was followed by the Anti-Corruption Information Center's first event in Vanadzor the discussion of the RA Government's Anti-Corruption Strategy Paper. Representatives of state and local self-governing bodies, NGOs and international organizations and the Mass Media were invited to the discussion. Also an anti-corruption action under the motto "*Anti-Corruption Day*" was organized in the town aimed at raising the public awareness in corruption and encouraging participation in the anti-corruption struggle.
- Since 2004, the National Assembly and UNDP Armenia have been implementing a joint project *Promoting Human Rights and Facilitating Public Awareness of the Public Defender's Office in Armenia*. Among seven members of the project Steering Committee Mr. Gevork Manoukian, ACRPC Chairman, has been nominated.
- In March 2003, ACRPC was included in the group working on the *UN Development Assistance Framework (UNDAF)*, which represented the collective, coherent and integrated response of the UN system to national priorities among them also the HRE through identifying the UN development assistance to Armenia in 2005-2009. The document was ratified by the Government of Armenia and UNDP Office in Armenia on December 1, 2004.

Press releases on the activities were made and disseminated through ACRPC web-site www.acrpc.am and the Mass Media.


