Dear Colleagues,

Let me present to your attention the Annual Report of 2005 of the Armenian Constitutional Right-Protective Centre.

During the year of 2005 our strategy aimed at developing legal culture in Armenia was supported by Interchurch Organization for Development Co-operation (ICCO) of the Netherlands, UNDP Armenia Agency, the US and British Embassies in Armenia, the Directorate of Youth and Sport of the Council of Europe Budapest and Oxfam GB Armenia.

- In support with ICCO the Armenian Human Rights School organized the following activities:
  - in-turn sessions of its Tenth and Eleventh Advanced Courses; and
  - legal awareness raising seminars for community leaders of Lori marz.

- Funded by the Department of State Public Affairs of the US Embassy in Armenia the expansion and development project of the Human Rights Library Network, located in the towns of Vanadzor, Hrazdan, Gavar, Artashat, Dilijan and Sevan towns, was implemented.

- The community members supported publication of five issues of the scientific-methodological review "For the Sake of Justice".

- In support with the Directorate of Youth and Sport of the Council of Europe and the British Embassy in Armenia strenuous work was done to fulfill the English-Armenian translation of "COMPASS a Manual on Human Rights Education with Young People". We have paid extreme attention to translating this unique

voluminous manual, granting exclusive copyright to ACRPC for its publication was already greatly binding.

- In support with UNDP Armenia the "Legal Culture" periodical newspaper was published, which aimed at formation and development of the civil society in Armenia.

- In support with Oxfam GB Armenia, ACRPC actively participated in the GCAP three mobilization days under the banner "White Band" and the organization presented the GCAP Armenian Coalition during the international meeting of civil society in Edinburgh in July 3-5, 2005.

- The international campaign held within the framework of the Global call for Education (GCE) involved more participants in comparison with the previous years. Since 2003, activities of its national coalition have been coordinated by ACRPC.

I would like to thank all the partners of ACRPC, its supporters and donors, all the staff members and volunteers, for their fair and unbiased efforts, due to which we implemented the above-mentioned projects.

**H**ISTORY IN BRIEF




The ACRPC was founded in 1988. It was registered in 1995 and re-registered in 2004 in the RA Ministry of Justice as a non-political, non-governmental, independent, right-protective organization. The ACRPC is lead by the principles set forth in the Universal Declaration of Human Rights and by law and justice given from above, as well as by the RA Constitution, the RA legislation in force and the ACRPC Charter.

In 2005 within the eight departments seventeen employees were involved. The implementation of the activities of the departments was also supported by the volunteers.

The departmental heads are accountable to ACRPC Chairman, and each employee is accountable to the corresponding departmental head.

The staff recruitment is through tender; priority is given to candidates with higher education, computer skills and language proficiency.

**STRUCTURE**



INTERNAL MONITORING AND EVALUATION SYSTEM

The staff-related activities are regulated by the ACRPC Work Regulations. The document was approved on December 22, 2002, by the ACRPC suprium body, the Assembly. It presents the organizational structure, job descriptions and general and specific responsibilities of the staff members, the work performance appraisal criteria, etc; the explicit bounds of authorities and responsibilities both among the departments and within each department are defined. The internal management, evaluation and monitoring,

is realized through a planning/reporting system (weekly, quarterly and annual) duly to the organization's strategic plans. The daily matters and issues are regulated through morning briefings of the ACRPC chairman-departmental heads individually. In case of necessity consultations are invited. The ACRPC submits project reports to its donor organizations, since 1999 it has been passing external financial audit and since 2002 it has been publishing annual reports as well.

INTERNAL CULTURE

Within the organization a culture has been formed, which represents the integrity of the staff members and the volunteers' behaviours, moral values and their beliefs. The organization's activity is transparent to its beneficiaries, partners, the community and the society in general. The staff members are progressive and goal-oriented, courteous and kind towards each other.

This is stimulated by various joint activities:

- The working hours are interrupted by an one-hour and fifteen-minute breaks,
- Staff retreat three-day programs are organized at least twice a year,
- The staff members and the volunteers' birthdays and national holidays are celebrated, etc.

The ACRPC management is consistent in providing the staff's sustainability and competitiveness.



ACTIVITIES IN 2005

ARMENIAN HUMAN RIGHTS SCHOOL

In 2005 the ACRPC Educational Department implemented the following activities:

- AHRs courses;
- Experience exchange conference of LS specialists; and
- Seminars for Lori region's community leaders

**AHRs Courses**  
The sessions of the Tenth and Eleventh Advanced Courses were organized. January 8-28, the first session of the Tenth Advanced Course was held. It was attended by 43 teachers from nine regions of the Republic. June 20-July 7, the first session of the Eleventh Advanced Course and the second session of the Tenth Advanced Course were organized<sup>1</sup>. It was the first time the AHRs had conducted a session in participation with learners of two various courses. That became possible due to application of the Teaching Organization Collaborative Methodology (TOCM)<sup>2</sup>. The session was attended by 93 learners from all regions of the Republic (52 learners of the Eleventh and 41 of the Tenth Courses). Fifteen trainers were involved in the sessions (two HR specialists, three methodologist-experts, nine LS specialists and an SL expert).

**Experience Exchange Conference of LS Specialists<sup>3</sup>**  
In June 27-28, an experience exchange conference of LS specialists was organized. It was attended by 63 people from various regions of the Republic: LS teachers, specialists, representatives of educational establishments, NGOs and the mass media. During the conference 14 reports were presented on three basic topics:  
- Educational policy: problems and perspectives;  
- Democracy and participation in decision making;  
- Legal state, education and upbringing.



**Seminars for Lori Regional Community Leaders<sup>4</sup>**  
In November-December three two-day seminars were organized on "Principles of Law and Legislation". The seminars were attended by 69 leaders of 16 communities of Gugark (November 12-13), Spitak (November 19-20) and Stepanavan (December 17-18) regions: council members, church representatives, educational establishments, NGOs, the private sector, the mass media, as well as volunteers and students). The participants of the seminars received certificates approved by the Governor of Lori region and the ACRPC Chairman.

The results of a sociological survey showed that the awareness on law and legislation of 50% of the participants was raised on average by 38.84%. During the seminars two live TV programs were broadcast in participation with community leaders, on December 17 via "Fortuna" TV Station of Stepanavan town and on December 19 via "Lori-TV" of Vanadzor town.

## HUMAN RIGHTS LIBRARY NETWORK

HRLN involves HR libraries in Vanadzor, Hrazdan, Dilijan, Artashat, Gavar and Sevan towns of Armenia.

### Implemented Work

- In January-September the implementation of the project “Human Rights Library Network Development in Armenia”, sponsored by the Department of State Public Affairs of the US Embassy in Armenia was continued.
- In February, in initiation with local volunteers and supported by authorities, the sixth HR library was founded in Sevan town. It was saturated with stationary, computer technique and books during the year.
- The HRLN literature fund was supplemented with necessary legal publications and informational packages. The literature was acquired in accordance

with the readers' demands.

- The IRTEK<sup>1</sup> program was installed in all the libraries of the Network, which is updated every three months.

- To develop the quality of provision of library services, two seminar-meetings of training and experience exchange of librarians were organized.

### Services

- 4538 readers made use of the HRLN services.
- The library fund was supplemented with 2373 pieces of new literature.
- The libraries subscribed to ten titles of republican and foreign press.
- 301 new readers signed up in the HRLN.

## ACTIVITIES IN 2005

### PUBLIC RELATIONS

ACRPC Department of Public Relations attaches value to partnership as an effective means for achieving the organization's goals. Accordingly, in 2005 we continued our efforts to develop and strengthen relations with local and international organizations, state structures, local self-governing bodies and educational establishments, the mass media and the public in general.

ACRPC is associated with UN Department of Public Information, it is a member to international and local networks and coalitions (see [www.acrpc.am/eng/Membership.html](http://www.acrpc.am/eng/Membership.html)).

In March the ACRPC representative was elected as a member of the Coordinating Council of the CRINGO Network. Since August 2005 the organization has been in *membership with the Civil Society Partnership Network (CSPN)*, which is coordinated by the Oxfam GB Armenia ([www.cso-network.am](http://www.cso-network.am)).

Since 2003 it has been coordinating the activity of GCE Armenian Coalition.

#### GCAP "White Band" Mobilization Day 3<sup>1</sup>

• On December 10, on the Human Rights and the G-CAP Third Mobilization Day, in support with the Oxfam GB Armenia, round tables were organized in the ACRPC HR libraries in six regions of the Republic, in participation with representatives of local and international organizations, local self-governing bodies, educational establishments, the mass media, students and others. Live programs were broadcast via regional TV stations "MIG" of Vanadzor town and "Hrazdan" of Hrazdan town.

#### First Annual Conference of ACRPC Supporters<sup>2</sup>

• On December 4, the First Annual Conference of ACRPC Supporters took place in the Conference Hall

of Vanadzor Municipality. ACRPC supporters, representatives of local and international organizations, the mass media, volunteers and beneficiaries from various regions of Armenia participated in the event. During the group discussions the participants spoke about the existing social problems and made their suggestions on solutions. These suggestions will be considered during the elaboration of the ACRPC Strategic Plan for 2007-2010.

#### "The European Union & Me" Project of British Council

• On October 12, within the framework of the project "The European Union and Me" of the British Council, a seminar-discussion was conducted in Vanadzor HR Library in participation with twelve young people. During the discussion the Armenian and European values were compared and points of view were exchanged.

#### GCAP "White Band" Mobilization Day 2<sup>3</sup>

• On September 10, in conjunction with the Oxfam GB Armenia, within the framework of the Second Mobilization Day of the Global Call to Action against Poverty a series of events were organized.

#### Discussions on Constitutional Amendments<sup>4</sup>

• On August 23, a meeting-discussion related to issues on constitutional amendments was organized and a live program was broadcast via the Vanadzor TV Station "Lori TV".

#### GCAP "White Band" Mobilization Day 1<sup>5</sup>

• On July 1, in conjunction with the Oxfam GB Armenia, ACRPC organized a series of activities within the campaign.

#### "Support to Children Devoid of Education" Project

• In July-October, supported by Vanadzor town's businessmen, the project "Support to Children Devoid of Education" was implemented, within the framework of which 21 children of various ages of Lori marz were sent to school, provided with complete sets of stationery and clothes.

#### "Support to Civil Society Anti-corruption Initiatives" UNDP Project

• In June-December, in Lori region, ACRPC participated in the implementation of the project "Support to Civil Society Anti-corruption Initiatives".

#### International Organization for Migration's activity for Prevention of Human Trafficking

• In June 23-24, in conjunction with the International Organization for Migration, the play "Burning Candles"



was performed, for which nearly 1000 invitation cards were distributed in Vanadzor town free of charge. A seminar on the issue of prevention of human trafficking was organized in which representatives of Vanadzor NGOs participated.

#### Expos 2005

• In April 6-8 and in March 15-17, the ACRPC was presented correspondingly in the Sixth "Education and Career 2005" and the "Education in Armenia 2005" International Specialized Expos within the framework of which the ACRPC was awarded a prize in the nomination "For Applying New Teaching Methods".


- Within the framework of the project of UNDP

## Annex 1

## ARMENIAN HUMAN RIGHTS SCHOOL: ADVANCED COURSE REPORT

**Goal**

From June 20 to July 7, 2005, the AHRS organized the first session of the eleventh and the second session of the tenth advanced courses. The goal of the joint session was to raise the level of theoretical knowledge of secondary school LS teachers of "Human Rights", "Civic Education" and "State and Law" and to develop their methodological skills of teaching.

**Learners**

The announcement on the admission to AHRS had been disseminated through the ACRPC website, the HRLN and also letters were sent to schools. In general, 79 applications were received from all the regions of the Republic. The selection of potential learners was held in two stages. The following selection criteria of the first stage were considered:

- The applicant educated the Legal Subjects or any of them at school.
- Existence of a recommendation from the head of the educational institution confirming that after completing the course the applicant would continue teaching the Legal Subjects or any of them.
- The applicant participated in the short-term courses provided by the Junior Achievement of Armenia. The second stage of the selection was an interview, the aim of which was to find out the applicant's expectations from the course, as well as to become sure that the learner took the obligation of implementing all the requirements of the AHRS programme (not to have any absence during the learning, to assimilate the full set of the themes and methods of the course programme and to continue educating the Legal Subjects).

In general, 93 learners from all regions of Armenia attended the session, from which 52 learners of the eleventh and 41 of the tenth courses (*Annex 1.1*). The course was conducted by ACRPC trainers' team in conjunction with invited methodologists, LS specialists and experts (*Annex 1.2*).

The opening ceremony of the course took place on June 21.

**Objectives**

The main objectives of the session were:

- to provide the course learners duly to the state academic programme of LS subjects for secondary schools with:
  - theoretical knowledge on the subjects;
  - innovative teaching methods;
  - innovative teaching skills based on respect for human rights and universal values;
- to provide favorable moral-psychological atmosphere in the process of teaching by:
  - individual approach towards every learner; and
  - stimulating the creation of positive interpersonal relations among the course learners.

**Methodology**

The work was organized through TOCM methods, Revene Direct and Reverse Method, Thematic Co-transfer Method, Individual Task Co-checking Method, Tact Method. Preliminary and general discussions and a test were conducted. Considering that most of the learners did not know the applied teaching methods, great attention was paid to monitoring of the academic process. For effective assimilation of the methods and the theoretical part of the theme, during the first week the trainers and some of the learners of the tenth course were involved in all the working groups. As soon as the learners had got fully involved in the process, the work in the groups was organized both without the trainers (by self-checking and self-control) and with their involvement, for contributing to the work organization. The main function of the monitoring was carried out by the responsible of the remote control panel and by means of periodical checking.

**Description**

It was the first time the AHRS had organized a session by involving learners of two courses. It was possible

due to organizing the activities through TOCM. According to the programme the learners were provided with 15 themes of the theoretical part: correspondingly:

- "Human Rights" - 6 themes
- "Civic Education" - 1 theme
- "State and Law" - 8 themes; and

Four TOCM methods:

- Revene Method
- Tact Method

- Method of Thematic Co-transfer
- Revene Reverse Method (*Annex 1.3*).

Delivering of the themes and the methods in the groups was organized jointly in participation with the learners of both courses.

**Results**

All the learners fully completed their assignments on the themes and methods presented in Chart 1.

## ANNEXES

On June 24, 27, and on July 5, the learners of the Tenth Advanced Course who had assimilated the themes and methods planned for the first and second tests, continued their learning through individual co-checking cards to get ready for their tests scheduled for June 25, 29 and July 6.

On the assimilated themes summing-up lectures and discussions were held by a specialist.

Two days of the session were devoted to International Humanitarian Law. From June 30 to July 1, the lecturers' team of ICRC Armenia Delegation, in the team of Ashot Astabatsyan, David Shahverdyan, Nvard Khachmalyan, Vladimir Margaryan, and Ruzanna Vardanyan and of the Armenian Red Cross Committee Lusine Stepanyan conducted a two-day seminar on International Humanitarian Law. On June 4, the UNHCR Armenia Office representative Armine Karakhanyan delivered a lecture and conducted practical lessons on the Refugees' Rights.

On the last day of the session, contracts were signed with the learners of the Eleventh Advanced Course on their further studies. According to it, the learner was considered as a graduate from the AHRs after he/she had fully assimilated the academic programme, passed the tests and the final examination. In case of

## EXPERIENCE EXCHANGE CONFERENCE: REPORT

In July 27-28, 2005, the first experience exchange conference of LS specialists was organized. The activity was attended by 63 people from various Regions of the Republic: LS teachers, education specialists, representatives of NGOs and the mass media.

To participate in the conference by January 31, 2005, in general 37 applications were received. **“Educational Policy: Problems and Perspectives”.**

Presentations were made also by Melanya Grigoryan (Shirak region), Stella Avagyan (Yerevan), Anna Baghdasaryan (Kotayk region), Astghik Avetisyan (Lori region), Tatev Shahverdyan (Lori region), Tehmina Kocharyan (Shirak region), Aida Petrosyan (Lori region), Margarit Ochinyan (Lori region), Anahit Sahakyan (Syunik region), Armen Petrosyan (Armavir region), Nelly Nazaryan (Armavir region), Shushanik Zakiyan (Kotayk region), Edmon Marukyan (Lori region).

The presentations were followed by and Q&A discussions.

The conference results were published in a separate report.

## Annex 3

## SEMINARS FOR COMMUNITY LEADERS: REPORT

In November-December, within the framework of the implementation of the Strategic Plan for 2003-2006, the ACRPC Armenian Human Right School, in conjunction with Lori Regional Administration, organized and conducted three two-day seminars on **“The Basics of Law and Legislation”** for Lori region community leaders.

The information on the seminars including the announcement and the note paper were disseminated to 62 communities of Gugark, Spitak and Stepanavan sub-regions of the Lori region, 54 educational establishments, NGOs through the mass media and the ACRPC website ([www.acrpc.am](http://www.acrpc.am)).

November 12-13, the first seminar for Gugark community leaders was held in Vanadzor town.

24 representatives from five communities of the region took part in the seminar. Among them were village governors, council members, representatives of NGOs, the private (business) sector, the mass media, and students.

The second seminar was held in November 19-20, in Spitak town, in the Town Library of Spitak. The participants were 29 representatives from six communities of the sub-region: village governors, council members and representatives of the Town Library, educational establishments, NGOs, the mass media and students.

The third seminar was held in December 17-18, in Stepanavan town. It was organized in partnership with NGO “Full Life”, in the office hall of which the seminar

was held. The participants were 16 representatives from five communities of the sub-region: representatives from the educational establishment, NGOs, the mass media, as well as a US PC volunteer. The agenda of the seminars included issues on the conceptions of “Law” and “Human Rights”, the RA Constitution, the “Civil Code” as well as laws on “The local self-governing bodies” and “Basics of Administration and Administrative Procedures”. Discussions and Q&A were held, as well as a practical activity “How convincing are you?” was exercised. (The activity was adapted from “Compass - a Manual on Human Rights Education with Young People, published by the CoE).

The participants of the seminars received legal-informational handouts of the agenda and additional topics, as well as certificates approved by the Lori Region Governor and the ACRPC Chairman.

All the three seminars were elucidated via local TV Stations.

The seminars were conducted by Gevork Manoukian (ACRPC, lawyer), Steve Bloom (US PCV), Arayik Papikyan (ACRPC, lawyer), Edmon Marukyan (expert, lawyer).

On December 17 and on December 19 live programs were broadcast correspondingly via TV Station “Fortuna” of Stepanavan, via “Lori” and “MIG” of Vanadzor. During the programs information on the seminars, the participants and the topics were presented.

## ANNEXES

At the beginning and at the end of the seminars an inquiry was made among the participants according to a questionnaire elaborated by the experts. It included questions on the topics of the seminar program. According to the structure and the content the questionnaire was divided into two parts: the first part were questions 1-3 for checking the theoretical knowledge and the second part - questions 4-12 on the practical use of the knowledge.

**The pre inquiry related to the first part gave the following results:**

In Vanadzor: there were 23 correct answers or 31.94 per cent out of possible 72 correct ones related to "Human Rights", "Human Rights Concept" and "Independence of Court".

In Spitak: there were 34 correct answers or 41.97 per cent out of possible 81.

In Stepanavan: 16 correct answers or 35.55 per cent out of possible 45.

The results of pre inquiry related to the second part were the following:

In Vanadzor: there were 129 correct answers or 38.39 per cent out of possible 336 correct answers related to "The Civil Code", "Local Self-governing Bodies", "Access to Information", "Basics of Administration and Administrative Procedure".

In Spitak: 163 correct answers or 43.12 per cent out of possible 378.

In Stepanavan: there were 79 correct answers or 37.61 per cent out of possible 210.

The pre inquiry gave the following general results: there were 444 correct answers or 38.09 per cent out of the possible correct answers.



**The results of the inquiry made at the end of the seminars were the following:**

The first part:

In Vanadzor: 49 correct answers or 77.77 per cent out of possible 63 correct ones.

In Spitak: 50 correct answers or 72.46 per cent out of possible 69 correct ones.

In Stepanavan: 31 correct answers or 73.80 per cent out of possible 42 correct answers.

The second part:

In Vanadzor: 165 correct answers or 56.12 per cent out of possible 294 correct answers.

In Spitak: 174 correct answers or 54.03 per cent out of possible 322 correct ones.

In Stepanavan: 94 correct answers or 47.95 per cent out of possible 196 correct ones.

The post inquiry gave the following general results: 563 correct answers or 63.68 per cent out of the possible correct answers.

Based on comparison of the pre and post inquiries, it was concluded that **the seminars had positive results in the sense of efficiency:** in particular, the average level of knowledge of the participants on the first (theoretical) part was increased from **36.48** up to **74.67** per cent, and that of the second part practical use was increased from **39.70** up to **52.70** per cent. **Summing up the figures, it can be stated that the level of the knowledge of the participants of the seminars was increased in more than twice related to the theoretical part and in about 1.5 times related to the practical part of it, or the average level was increased from 38.09 per cent (the result of the pre inquiry) up to 63.68 per cent (the result of the post inquiry).**

## DISCUSSIONS ON CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENTS: REPORT

On August 23, 2005, ACRPC in partnership with Vanadzor NGO Resource Center organized a meeting at "Argishti" Hotel of Vanadzor City concerning the RA Constitutional amendments and in the evening, an on-air TV program via "Lori TV" Channel on the aforementioned theme.

To make the meeting effective, on August 19 and 22 at the Vanadzor Resource Center, two preliminary meetings were held with in participation with representatives of NGOs, the mass media, LSGBs and state bodies of Lori region. 26 suggestions were elaborated for the Draft Constitution.

In the meeting of August 23 the Armenia Legislation Strengthening Program's (ALSP) Vice-Director Mr. John Armstrong, Specialist on State Structures-Ms. Lilit Hakobyan, and Consultant on Public Policy-Mr. Edward Safaryan, the Third Secretary of the British Embassy in Armenia-Ms. Naira Sultanyan, the US PCV and a former federal judge Mr. Steve Bloom, a

representative of "Ardarutyun" ("Justice") Faction - Mr. Frunze Tadevosyan, as well as representatives of 18 NGOs, two state bodies and four Massmedia agencies of Lori region took part.

There was efficient discussion during the meeting and nearly all the participants made their proposals. Eventually, a draft paper was developed with 28 proposals, which the next day was sent to the NA Administration and the heads of factions.

That evening, an on-air TV program was broadcast via "Lori TV" Channel in participation with Lori Regional NGO representatives and PCV Mr. Steve Bloom. During the on-air broadcast community members were also involved by phoning in questions and comments on the constitutional amendments. The called in questions were answered by the participants. Mr. Steve Bloom presented some points concerning the American Constitution which were of interest to the audience.

## GCAP "WHITE BAND" MOBILIZATION DAY 1: REPORT

On July 1, 2005, in conjunction with Oxfam GB Charity Organization, ACRPC organized and held activities within the frames of the "First White Band Mobilization Day in Armenia". Massive rallies focused on poverty and education issues took place in Vanadzor and Hrazdan towns of Armenia (Lori and Kotayk regions). Around 1500 people, 70 secondary school teachers of Legal Subjects among, united under the slogans of "Make Poverty History", "Global Justice", "No Child Devoid of Education" and others to join the Global Campaign efforts. The rallies ended up by the meeting in the central squares of Vanadzor and Hrazdan, with the speeches on behalf of civil society organizations and children.
